Meet Ken Rist


Your Liberal Democrat candidate standing for South Portslade on January 11th

This by-election has been caused by the resignation of Labour Councillor Les Hamilton. Here is **Ken Rist's** tribute to our long-serving respresentative. Les started as a councillor for Portslade UDC and became well respected, as was his father who was our local Co-op insurance agent in the 50s and 60s. Les's mother was organist at church of Good Shepherd, Mile Oak until she was 98 years old.

In the late 1960's, he was an excellent Math's teacher at Portslade Secondary Modern school (after my time!) and he taught my sister's children very well and helped them to get great GCE and CSE results.

He has always been a hard working councillor for the local community of Portslade and will no doubt remain active in the community. I wish him a happy retirement.

SAVE OUR SCHOOL

The announcement of the proposed closure of St Peter's school is shocking and saddening for parents and residents. The decision seems to have been rushed through, ignoring the important and unique characteristics of the school. Under the proposed new plans, many of the children would be forced to attend Mile Oak, which is over 40 minutes' walk away. This decision may increase car journeys across Portslade, with negative consequences for traffic and environment.

St Peter's closure would also result in the loss of nursery-age classes, and could lead to dereliction of a much-loved, community asset. If elected, Ken will make it a priority on the Council to fight against the closure of St Peter's and other similar short-sighted proposals in the future.

Is Portslade getting its fair share?

Together with **Michael Wang**, the LibDem prospective parliamentary candidate for Hove and Portslade, Ken embarked on a local tour to scrutinise the Council's maintenance shortcomings. They observed the neglected state of Manor Road, where the middle resrvation has been damaged, presumably by a speeding vehicle and yet remains unrepaired. Together, they call for the Council to break away from the habit of focusing on expensive vanity projects and get the basics right, while Michael further notes the need for a fundamental rethink of the local authority funding process at Westminster.

Michael says: "Ken's knowledge and passion for South Portslade is impressive and infectious. He will be a champion for the local area."



Ken added: "Once again Portslade is the forgotten part of Brighton

and Hove, if elected I will become a active campaigner for our part of the City. For example, the memorial of the Portslade Gassie has been totally neglected. It was an important Ferry service across the canal and should be restored"
